Upper School Division Profile & Accommodations

CBA Upper School students have the option of participating in-person, on-line, or via a blended model in which they move freely between in-person and on-line instruction. No matter where they choose to learn, the student's education is personalized to meet their individual learning needs.

The following accommodations are available to support the success of our students.

- Use of Canvas LMS
